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## Section 4 - FIRST AID MEASURES

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### SWALLOWED

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## Section 5 - FIRE FIGHTING MEASURES

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### EXTINGUISHING MEDIA

### FIRE FIGHTING

### FIRE/EXPLOSION HAZARD

- Non combustible.

  - Decomposes on heating and may produce toxic fumes of carbon monoxide (CO).

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## Section 7 - HANDLING AND STORAGE

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### PROCEDURE FOR HANDLING

- Limit all unnecessary personal contact.
- Wear protective clothing when risk of exposure occurs.

- Polyethylene or polypropylene container.
- Packing as recommended by manufacturer.

### PERSONAL PROTECTION

#### EYE

- Safety glasses with side shields
- Chemical goggles.
- Contact lenses may pose a special hazard; soft contact lenses may absorb and concentrate irritants. A written policy document, describing the wearing of lens or restrictions on use, should be created for each workplace or task. #### ACUTE HEALTH EFFECTS

#### SWALLOWED
